Join the network of energy and sustainability professionals and spend a summer working to advance climate solutions in high-impact organizations around the world. Since 2008, Climate Corps has placed over 1,400 fellows in leading private and public sector organizations including including City of Seattle, AirBNB, CAVA, Etsy, and Goldman Sachs. As a Climate Corps fellow, you will:

- be custom-matched with a host organization based on your location, industry and project type preferences;
- spend 10-12 weeks designing tools and recommendations to accomplish emissions reduction goals;
- participate in an interactive training and have access to ongoing professional development opportunities and mentorship.

As a Climate Corps fellow, Jess helped the NYC Mayor's Office of Sustainability advance Mayor de Blasio's goal of reducing NYC's greenhouse gas emissions 80 percent by 2050. Now the Senior Director of Agriculture & Sustainability at McCain Foods, Jess leads a team responsible for the strategy and execution of McCain's 2025 & 2030 sustainability goals for regenerative agriculture, water use efficiency, carbon intensity and supporting rural livelihoods.

As a 2019 Climate Corps fellow, Karan worked with GAF Materials to perform a solar feasibility study for their manufacturing sites and a materials life cycle analysis to inform supply chain decision making. Recruiting occurs through virtual info sessions and conferences throughout the fall. Watch a prerecorded info session or register for a live event on our website.

We have two application deadlines, November 29, 2022 and January 10, 2023. If you apply by November 29, you will have access to a more robust list of projects.



Review Projects

EDF will provide a list of 2023 participating organizations and projects, and you will indicate which you are most interested in. You cannot apply directly for a specific host organization.



Interview

Your interview will be virtual. Early applicant interviews are in January to mid-February and regular applicant interviews are in mid-February to March.



Enter a pool of candidates eligible for a match. Matches with host companies will happen in February for early applicants and March for regular applicants.



After you accept the match, we connect you with your potential host organization supervisor for final confirmation.
